Being raised by a single mother, I witnessed the challenges she faced raising her children alone. But what became more fascinating to me as I grew up was realising that all the other single mothers in my street were silently going through the same thing. It made our situation at home not unique but a collective problem that our parents never openly spoke about.

# MINENHLE LUTHULI DIRECTOR

#### ABANY'OMAMA (SOME MOTHERS) | MA

In the sugarcane farming community in rural Kwa-Zulu Natal, Ntombi, Balungile, and MaKhanyile are facing challenges in raising their daughters. Due to Ntombi's negligence and alcoholism, she accidentally pours boiling oil over her 6-year-old daughter. Overwhelmed with shock and fear, Ntombi decides to keep her daughter at home and attempts to treat her injuries, avoiding the scrutiny of outsiders, especially Miss Mlaba.

Balungile takes pride in her daughter Zethe, who has always made her look good. However, Zethe's unexpected pregnancy at the age of 17 threatens her plans to study

medicine next year. In an effort to maintain the facade of a perfect daughter within the local community, Balungile secretly adds an abortion pill to Zethe's food against her will.

Meanwhile, MaKhanyile's granddaughter, Phumla, is facing difficulties obtaining an ID due to bureaucratic challenges. The frustration and humiliation Phumla experiences become overwhelming. MaKhanyile, preoccupied with her own life filled with mourning and grieving with other families, ignores Phumla's frustrations.

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER PROFILE**

Minenhle Luthuli is a filmmaker from KZN, South Africa. She holds an honours degree in Motion Picture Medium and her graduation film, Umsolwa (The Accused) won the Best Student Film at the 2018 Simon Sabela Awards. Through her production company she has been able to write, direct and produce a number of short films such as Heart Attack currently streaming on Showmax and Get Ready With Me (2022 NEFTI Short Film Competition). She is currently developing her first short film, Abany'Omama (Some Mothers).

#### **BIG TREE**

Ten years into the future, a young woman named Anena invents a technology called Yat Madit that fosters direct democracy. It runs on an open-source algorithm modelled on decentralised social media and uses cheap, 3D-printed devices. The technology enables thousands of people to be joint presidents, hundreds to form committees to replace ministers, and every citizen to be a parliamentarian. Citizens are eager to adopt Yat Madit, but Anena can't celebrate this success because her mother goes missing under mysterious circumstances. She suspects her father killed her and hid the body.

Meanwhile, a biotechnologist named Tabaro seeks government patronage for his startup and convinces a dictator to replace riot police with genetically modified butterflies. The butterflies infect people with a neurotic disease similar to The Nodding Syndrome, causing suicide by self-mutilation. Now the government has an excuse to ban Yat Madit, claiming that Anena's invention is a public health hazard that causes this strange sickness. Tabaro demonstrates that this is

more effective than brute force and can be reused in the future against any opposition without staining the government's image with blood.

While searching for her mother's body, Anena finds a strange insect. It turns out to be Tabaro's creation, which, defying his safeguards, mated with a natural butterfly and is now uncontrollable. Anena discovers the true cause of the disease, and it pushes people to get rid of centralised governance. A revolution brews.

In desperation, the government sends trigger-happy soldiers to confiscate Yat Madit gadgets. It's bloody, and people resist. Then butterflies infect the soldiers, and they flee, leaving the village to deal with the killer insects and the pandemic.

Anena eventually finds her mother alive, but she can't have a happy ending because she blames herself for the tragedy that has befallen the village.



#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

With science fiction, I can find solutions to bad leadership and dictatorships in our cultures. Before colonialism, forms of democracy with no central governance thrived in Acholi, where this story is set, and it's not far-fetched to imagine a near future where today's digital technologies and algorithms inspire a revolution that gives birth to direct democracy.

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER PROFILE**

**Dilman Dila**, the director, is a writer and filmmaker who has been listed for many prestigious prizes, including Best Short Fiction at the British Science Fiction Association Awards (2021). His films have won multiple awards, including *The Felistas Fable* (2013).



Flavia Bukojja, the producer, has a passion for accounting and brings her skills to running film sets. Her credits include Production Manager on two TV series and producer of four short films and the mini-series, *Kabi and Kalo* (2023).

#### **BLACKASS**

Furo Wariboko, a young Lagosian man with no job or prospects, turns to fast money-making schemes in a desperate bid to improve his situation. His sister Tekena, an ambitious entrepreneur, contrasts his struggles. They reside in Lagos slums with their father, whom Furo despises for his failed business ventures.

A chance encounter with a mysterious stranger in a bar leads to Furo waking up one morning to discover that, overnight, he has turned into a white man! As he makes his way through Lagos, the largest black city in the world, with his new identity, he begins to realise that this change could actually be a blessing. When he secures his dream job, meets a beautiful young woman, and gets invited to stay with her at her place - all in the same day - he slowly begins to look at his situation in a new light. There is just one small

problem - his ass, in stark contrast to the rest of him, remains as black as ever!

He soon confides in Tekena, who is horrified by his change. She wants her brother back and tries to convince him to look for ways to change back. Furo, however, has different ideas - his new identity has opened up a whole new side of Lagos to him, one that he never dreamed he could be a part of. He has begun to enjoy his elevated status and has even picked a new name for himself - Frank Whyte. Not everyone is fooled by his attempts to pass as a member of the upper class, though. It will take more than a new name to distance himself from his unapologetically black ass, from his penniless past, and from his sister who seems determined to drag him back into it.

#### REEL PREVIEWS

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

What I have always loved about *Blackass* is that it's a humorous visual tale. There's nothing as Nigerian as the use of biting comedy to discuss bleak social issues. Elevating whiteness in a black country is bizarre, a mystical catfish. I want the audience to come on this journey through labyrinthine Lagos - a maze of freakish mirrors and colourful characters.

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER PROFILE**

**Tolulope Ajayi** is an award-winning filmmaker who has created several socially impactful short films that have won awards in over 5 festivals, including the AFRIFF Jury award. He is currently in post-production with his debut feature film, *Over The Bridge*.



#### COCONUT

In 2005, as a distraught Ofilwe Tlou (15) listens to a sombre funeral sermon, her mind wanders back to 1997. A confident, outspoken Ofilwe (8), her quiet, funny brother Tshepo (10), and their parents Gemina, a passionate nurse, and ambitious John, who has just landed a top tech job, are the first black family to move into the elite yet hostile Little Valley, a high-walled Johannesburg estate.

After her first overt experience of racism at her new, mostly white school, Ofilwe decides to change who she is to fit in while Tshepo's macho, cold, all-boys private school makes him yearn to go back to their township community in Mabopane. An overworked and secretly undermined John, an outsider in corporate South Africa, forces his children to assimilate despite how destructive it is, believing they will never have to suffer like him.

REEL PREVIEWS

Over the years, an anxious Gemina, who struggles to grasp the peculiar ways of suburbia, watches Ofilwe transform into someone that resents her and the values she instilled in her, Tshepo become angrier at the world and his father, and John drift away from their marriage and family. In Tshepo's rebellion and search for community, he befriends Fikile (17), a waiter at their local restaurant desperate to escape poverty and much darker circumstances. Through Fikile, a gutted Tshepo realises that he neither fits into his old nor new world.

Fikile learns that the Tlou family is not living the South African "freedom fairy tale" she had imagined and coveted. And seven years after the Tlou family moves to Little Valley Estate when all of them are changed forever and one of them is no longer alive, Ofilwe finally contemplates loving and accepting who she is and where she comes from.

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

I want to tell a nuanced, complex, and sometimes humorous tragedy of how South Africa's democracy and freedom is a dream deferred for the majority who remain poor as well as the black middle class who had to assimilate into a white world that rejects them while constantly being on the verge of losing themselves and their precarious status.







#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER PROFILE**

Karabo Lediga's short film, What Did You Dream? premiered in competition at Clermont-Ferrand International Short Film Festival and won Best African Short at the Durban International Film Festival. Her writing and directorial work includes the two-time I-Emmy nominated satirical show Late Nite News with Loyiso Gola. She's also in development on her feature film titled Sabbatical. She's a Berlinale Talents, Less Is More and TIFF Writers' Studio alumnus.

#### **EVERY STITCH A LONELY THREAD**

After a tragic roadside accident that sends him into a coma, a young municipal worker, Lemohang Mpanza, is possessed by ancestral visions who prophesied that he will begin a new religious faith. Awoken by these visions, he abandons his previous life and draws toward him a congregation of those marginalised by his city.

Alongside this journey, we explore short episodes from his life as a young boy in early 90s South Africa. We meet his mother Ramatla, who works as a domestic worker in a wealthy suburb; his father, Mthetheleli, a sower of garments for the local churches and Bina, his younger sister. We come to learn about the deep-seated loss that has afflicted this family and the ways in which this loss has led to its collapse and Lemohang's formation.

This straddling of past and present is the cinematic language that immerses us in our

central character's narrative: the rise and fall of a radical homeless preacher. Together with his congregation, and accompanied by his ancestral visions, Lemohang grows a church, occupying land to build a makeshift commune embedded in new radical spiritual rituals. They dress themselves in elegant white cloth, creating their own music that expresses the content of their lives and aspirations for the church; it is gospel protest.

But this movement begins to clash with a hostile city determined to wash away and invisibilize its homeless. Through this clash, we witness the slow demise of the church and Lemohang himself. Unable to cope with his family's past traumas and the violence of his city, Lemohang is driven to a reckless rage that no longer nourishes his church. Blinded by paranoia, Lemohang loses his grip on reality, pushing himself and the church to their utmost limits.



#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

With a magical-realist approach grounded in arthouse cinema, this film tackles questions of historical trauma, spirituality and our connection to this land. It is a telling of us, in our chaotic nuance, scored by the voices of prophecy. I believe cinema can meet the madness of our time with a spell whose name is awe.

#### GASLIGHT | BURBZ

In the depths of inner turmoil, Alisha (23) conceals the scars of self-harm beneath baggy street fashion. Determined to confront the death of her little sister and find closure, she grapples with the persistent blame of her grieving parents. Driven to run away, she embarks on a journey along the N2 highway, with her destination set on Durban, the city where it all transpired one fateful year before – a place her parents dare not tread.

Crossing the threshold of her abandoned family home, Alisha gathers the friends she had once alienated – united by the same harrowing night that tore them apart. Together, they strive to reclaim their lives and build a brighter future, yet the weight of their shared trauma continues to obstruct their path. Seeking solace in music, reckless sex, intoxication, and mind-altering experiences,

they lose themselves in the pulsating rhythm of late nights and neon-lit escapades – a world of wild benders.

As their friendships and relationships hang in the balance, the group must confront their shared trauma before the destructive forces within them push someone to the brink of tragedy. In a tempest of secrets, lies, and shattered lives, they face a daunting choice: either find the strength to make amends, expose their truths, and seek redemption, or succumb to the merciless force of the truth that not everyone can survive. Will they navigate the storm and emerge stronger, or will they be consumed by the wreckage left in its wake?

### REEL PREVIEWS

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

My best friend died. There is a rite of passage for survival into adulthood growing up in South Africa. A way that trauma interacts with substance abuse, clubs, and love. Not every young person survives.

I realised an urgent need to explore our desperate search for healing. 'Gaslight' is this unflinching portrayal, bringing a fresh city to this world-favourite genre.

#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER PROFILE**

Fiction, a balm for healing the broken modern heart. Emma Tollman, founder of Tollman Film Company, prioritises women's voices on both sides of the camera. Her work includes short films like 'Thorns' (Amazon Prime Video) and 'Songbird.' Emma has participated in prestigious labs such as HUB@Goethe Institute and Durban FilmMart Business Lab in 2022, and she is currently mentored by Durban Access and the Independent Producer's Organisation's Get On Set Mentorship. She developed an oddball romcom short in collaboration with the KZN Film Commission in 2022 and co-produced Gaslight with Rous House Productions.

#### GRAFT

Nina, a young, up-and-coming singer, mysteriously loses her voice after undergoing surgery for her vocal cords. Desperate for answers, and unable to obtain any reasonable explanation scientifically, her budding career collapses, and her life begins to spiral out of control.

A now mute Nina finds comfort in Herbert, a now infamous soccer star who seems to have lost his talent for the game overnight. The duo cross paths with an ageing writer who, despite his arthritis, is adamant that his gift for writing was stolen from him.

Piecing together that they all had surgical procedures done at the same clinic, the

trio's trail leads them on a daring manhunt for the man they believe to have stolen their talents and sold them off to high-end, untalented clientele. Hellbent on reclaiming what was taken from them, the trio forces the man who robbed them to reveal the secret underground world of the talent market as they trace each person whose gifts were sold to.

The writer's gift was sold to a failing university student from a wealthy family. Herbert's talent was sold to the striker of a rival team. And Nina discovers that her estranged mother, a has-been singer of the past, purchased Nina's voice for herself.

#### **GRANNY LEE**

In the late '80s in Apartheid South Africa, a disco-dancing, white-passing trans granny named Granny Lee, known for her outrageous antics, sharp tongue, constant boozing, and handmade outfits, spends her pensioning days as the "Grandmother" to the lost queer babes of Johannesburg. When one such queer babe, Billy, dies from AIDS, Granny Lee finds herself a witness at his closed-casket funeral service arranged by his wealthy white right-wing family.

Granny Lee and her misfit children steal Billy's body and carry out the burial he requested in Soweto. After a chance meeting with the boy's stoic grieving mother, Irene, Granny Lee sets out to befriend and bedazzle her, and the two women develop an unlikely friendship, each with a set of ulterior motives for their forays outside of their own comfort zones:

REEL PREVIEWS (PASSWORD: River2023)

As the boy's chosen quardian, Granny Lee seeks to enlighten Irene to the wonders of the queer community with the hopes of winning his wasted college fund for the Soweto AIDS clinic and her own house of spurned children. Irene, on the other hand, hatches a secret revenge plot against her estranged son's mysterious lover, whom she views as his 'murderer'.



Kana Wamba (20s), is the owner of a home-based boutique catering business selling edibles and recreational drugs that has clients from all over Nairobi. She has a huge following on social media. She has a difficult relationship with her father, George Wamba and when he dies, she misses his funeral. Later, she goes back to her hometown in Central Kenya with the idea to sell off his farm to expand her business and be rid of her father's memory. She discovers that the title deed to the farm is missing.

Sebi, her father's long-serving farm manager, attempts to remind her of the importance of their farm. Her father George was the custodian of this secret breed of coffee that possesses psychedelic properties. Through a shamanic ritual that was conducted by him while he was alive, the partakers of this concoction would be mentally transported to the spiritual realm of the dead and commune

with their ancestors – to find closure, comfort or even advice.

Kana's uncle and surrogate father, Steven Wamba, who is a power broker, hatches a plan to sell the farm's coffee produce which has always been maintained as a secret by the community. What Kana doesn't know is that Steven wants to sell the Wamba coffee as a recreational drug to a pharmaceutical company in Nairobi.

Kana is torn between going back to her successful business in Nairobi and taking on the shamanic role as expected by the community. Deep down she really wants to reconnect with George and knows that the coffee has the power to grant her access to her father in the other world. Kana must overcome her bias against her father, fight to retain her rightful ownership of the farm, and reconnect with the one thing that she shuns the most: home.

I was orphaned at two. I have no memories of my father. My mother, unable to take care of me and my siblings, gave us up to be raised by relatives. I find myself an emotional nomad, not knowing how to explain or understand insecurities and struggle to love and accept love, because then it was never concrete and very unfamiliar. Kana Wamba experiences this in the film.

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#### NOMVELO AND THE WOLF

Nomvelo and the Wolf is a coming-of-age creature feature about a 17-year-old Zama Zama named Nomvelo. He digs abandoned mines by night in search of specks of precious minerals and alloys to sell to survive. One night, while deep in the mine with his older brother, they are caught in a rockslide. In the absolute darkness of the mine, Nomvelo witnesses his brother get mauled by a vicious and mysterious creature. At the behest of his bloody brother, Nomvelo escapes the mine and runs into the night, the sole survivor.

As Nomvelo grieves his murdered brother, he starts to investigate the mystery of the creature down the mines. What was that beast? Where did it come from? Will it return? As more people in the small town turn up dead, Nomvelo meets Nandi, a young girl whose father was also killed by the creature,

and together they delve into the rabbit hole of the werewolf that shakes the small town of Hitchcock to its very core.

Driven by vengeance for his brother, fighting cowardice and fear, our heroes embark on a quest to solve the mystery of the beast and ultimately hunt the werewolf. They team up with a ragtag group of young misfits to save their town and avenge their loved ones.

#### PHARMING

Pharming is a high-impact hour-long crime drama that takes a new look at the global drug trade through an African lens. Unlike Narcos and White Stripes that are about the illegal trade of illicit drugs, Pharming deals with the illegal trade of licit pharmaceuticals – a multi-billion dollar industry that most of the world knows nothing about. It is estimated that in Central Africa, up to 50% of all pharmaceuticals are either counterfeit or substandard – a staggering fact that lays the foundation for a new playground of cops and robbers where the biggest drug dealers in the world sit behind boardroom tables and do their business in plain sight.

Pharming takes us from the C-suites of first-world countries to the safe suburbs of the self-medicating middle classes, all the way into the depths of 3rd world Africa. A pharmaceutical company owner in Canada

tries to cover up not only the tests and results of a 'miracle' malaria vaccine but also the ghosts of his father's legacy, desperate to keep his daughter and new heir to the throne in the dark. A middle-class Zulu woman in Johannesburg takes control of her husband's flailing bottling factory, without knowing the much bigger part she is to play in a world that gives us both hope and bloodshed. A retired security consultant in the middle of Ghana unearths a plot to kill millions and shake the very foundation of an industry that we have all come to blindly trust out of desperation.

Pharming takes the empire drama of Succession, the high-octane action of Lord of War, and the suburban politics of Weeds, creating an interlinked tapestry of order and chaos where we never really know who is in the driving seat.

## DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT

Growing up, some of my favourite TV shows were about cops and robbers, with clear-cut good guys and bad guys. As the director of *Pharming*, my aim is to take a more nuanced approach to the global drug trade, particularly within the pharmaceutical industry. The show delves into the complex shades of grey that exist in this world, particularly in Africa and within the sphere of big pharma.

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## BEYOND FELA (FORMERLY TITLED THE DARKER SIDE OF AFROBEATS)

Nigeria has a complicated relationship with women, and this is reflected in the music industry. This story documents the journey from shortly after Nigeria's independence, to celebrate female musicians such as Onyeka Onwenu whose voice and music was a source of comfort and solidarity during the Biafran war. The heart-warming and breaking story of the Lijadu twins, little known cousins of Fela Kuti who were signed to the same label as Fela but were not given the same support.

Afrobeats emerged in the nineties – a genre that was created and dominated by men, but we discover there were successful female musicians. Female artists such as

Mo'Cheddah, Sasha P, Tiwa Savage, Waje, and Seyi Shay made their mark on the music scene. They were popular with chart topping hits and sold-out performances. For the first time, they share their stories of how bullying, sexual harassment, rivalries, and sexism became obstacles.

The new generation of musicians such as Tems, Ayra Starr, and Amaraee are charting their path. They are the future, who benefited from local and international feminist movements. However, though the future is considerably better for women, there are still some obstacles that are ever present.

We hope to present a narrative that allows women to speak freely about their challenges in the music industry but also celebrate their contributions. Nigerian music is a global force. However, there is a gender imbalance in the industry. Women do not enjoy the same level of success. We can celebrate this genre but also question institutions that prioritise one gender over the other.

Set in the city of Kef, CIRTA is a hybrid film project that combines a short-fictionalised film and a feature-length documentary whose conception and making echo and complement each other.

Although there are no more cinemas in this region today, for many years a magical place has illuminated the lives of the inhabitants of Le Kef: the cinema CIRTA.

CIRTA may have closed its doors over thirty years ago, yet its name remains shrouded in nostalgia, associated with many anecdotes that have forged the local mythology.

The CIRTA theatre was then the great dream provider for a particular group of kids whose ultimate goal was to sit in front of this screen of wonders. Unable to afford tickets for the whole group, they scramble each week to raise the money needed for a single ticket.

In preparation of a fictionalised short film that will recapture the golden age of his hometown's movie theatre, a filmmaker begins to chronicle the daily lives of teenage misfits he has chosen to play the leading parts.

This movie seeks to pay tribute to this iconic cinema while simultaneously portraying the birth of a cinephilia in an unconventional and subversive way.

Sékou Timité has one ambition: to follow in his late father's footsteps and become a "Djeli", a griot, guardian of the oral memory in West Africa. Being the only one of his siblings to take an interest in the obsolete art of the griot, newly married Sékou leaves his family behind and sets off to confront the modern world on the roads of the legendary Manding Empire. For Sékou, it is more than a quest for memory, it is a personal quest in search of the father he never knew and the teachings he never received from him.

Despite his doubts and the many obstacles of a chaotic present, he crosses paths with the greatest griots of the region and with simple individuals in contact with daily life. 74-year-old Eaglette was the most soughtafter singer and performer during the most politically and culturally repressed time in South Africa's apartheid history. Her voice and stage presence were described as mesmerising and transcendental by fans and peers alike. However, despite her incredible talent, she has been completely erased from the country's entertainment history, while her former bandmates became celebrated artists in South Africa. Why is that? What happened?

After years of industry exploitation and abuse, Eaglette gave up on her musical dreams and led a life of emotional turmoil, substance abuse, and self-destruction. However, now, after 40 years, Eaglette is finally ready to face her past, confront her producers/bandmates, and demand the answers she deserves. Where is her recorded music? Where are her royalties?

We follow Eaglette and her filmmaker daughter on their search for answers and to hear her voice in a recording she's never heard before.

This incredible documentary will take you on a journey through the late '60s and early '70s South African music scene, where musicians had to navigate apartheid repression to make their voices heard. 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#### FLYING LIKE A BIRD

The Colokolo were all born in Salé, a city which was famous in the 17th century as the harbour of pirates and which is today the dormitory suburb of Rabat, the Moroccan capital. In 2009, behind the walls of the Kasbah, a circus school opened and quickly became an escape for parents who feared their children would become delinquents. This is where young Badr, Ismail, Ammar, Ali, Hassan, Snoopy and Hamza met and began to practise the teeterboard, an apparatus that propels them up to 10 metres in height.


In 2013, they left the school because of the authoritarian pedagogy, unpaid work and a ban on practising teeterboard, and founded an autonomous circus collective: The Colokolo. Born in Salé, Mehdi El Lyoubi has been following the creation of their new show since 2019 and the many obstacles they are facing: the absence of rehearsal spaces, the lack of financial means, the difficulty of getting visas to perform abroad.

The Colokolo often express their desire to leave Morocco, but after a few weeks of touring, they feel homesick and are happy to return to port. Mehdi's camera captures the tension between Hamza, the youngest and most talented flyer, and the others, the difficult task of reconciling the ideals that have forged their collective, the family constraints for some, the individual ambitions for others, and the social pressure for all. Today, Mehdi lives in Europe, and making Flying Like A Bird may be his way to pay a debt he feels to his city and his friends.

#### DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT

With the Colokolo, we share this feeling of "being both so close and so far away" from Morocco. They represent for me a powerful model of integrity, non-conformism. So, I will take with my camera as many risks as they take with their bodies. A gesture that will seal our artistic and political complicity to affirm that we are true heirs of the pirates of Salé.

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#### IN MY FATHER'S HOUSE

Thirty years ago, when I was 16, my father forced me to choose between two marriage proposals. At eighteen, I got married, and it turned into a very violent and abusive marriage. My father looked the other way and ignored my problems. Today, I'm searching for answers before time runs out because my father has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. The damage between us runs deep, and the memories seem distant.


In My Father's House, also explores inner exiles: deviations from oneself, deviations from the norms that a father, a mother, and their children have internalised before daring to confront them, each at their own pace. In addressing these questions, my documentary goes beyond being merely a historiographical account of Moroccan immigration. It delves into the heart of the "women" issues, which underpin the life journeys of both myself, the filmmaker, and my father.

Over the years, my father has amassed a vast family archive, and I invited him to work together on a film - a film within a film - to discuss our past, both the good and the bad. He initially said YES, and I purchased two director's chairs, and we began shooting. However, he later said 'NO' out of fear of discussing these sensitive subjects. On my motorcycle, I travel to Morocco in search of answers from the past and to reconnect with my father. The act of filming itself disrupts and thwarts all the norms and plans of my family to make this film impossible. It's a deeply personal creative documentary that explores my striking freedom, which has overcome cultural, religious, and social prohibitions. In doing so, the cinematic gesture that underlies the film is resolutely liberating.

This is a heartfelt story where sincerity, honesty and humour are the main tones. Our behaviour is shaped by our upbringing. We learn it from our parents, whether consciously or unconsciously. 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#### THE CIRCUIT

Bana is a former motorcycle trafficker who used to buy motorcycles in Nigeria and transport them to Cameroon and the Central African Republic for sale. Seven years ago, Bana got married and left this dangerous and illegal job to pursue a career in making traditional music for weddings and baptisms. However, after his father's passing, he became the head of the family, and the weight of his responsibilities increased.

Despite his stage performances and earning small amounts of money from local phone companies that use his music as on-hold ringtones, Bana constantly finds himself in debt and unable to lead the life he sees other artists living. Determined to gain popularity and find new sources of income, he decides

to seek out popular singers for collaboration and change his repertoire. To accomplish this, he requires funds to record a new album.

Despite his efforts to borrow money from his family and banks, Bana's attempts are in vain. His friend Séka Séka, the leader of the traffickers, agrees to help him on the condition that Bana undertakes one last trip with the gang. This journey involves a perilous motorcycle journey between Nigeria and Cameroon, navigating uncharted tracks, evading police and customs, and putting his own life at risk while carrying a heavy load of two-wheelers. Bana sets out once again on the roads with his band, embarking on this journey between Nigeria and Cameroon.



#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

Arice Siapi: I want to talk about a Cameroonian youth trapped by a system that has marginalised them. I want to show that this deprived youth, who has a code of honour, is courageous and determined to fight until the end.

Martinel Nemalieu: Having grown up in Ngaoundéré, Arice, with whom I share a long collaboration since *Riskou* at IDFA 2008, shares a similar background to mine.

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#### BETWEEN HEAVEN AND EARTH

In 2013, a mob of extremists in southern Aleppo beheaded the statue of the 11th-century Syrian poet Al-Ma'arri. Al-Maâri was a free thinker who spoke out against political and religious powers of his time, and he was visually impaired from the age of 4. He is also considered to be the first known vegetarian and an inspiration to Dante Alighieri.

Amal, a young contemporary artist, has an encounter with Al-Ma'arri who returns from the past and finds himself trapped in his body again. In an act of resistance, Amal creates an animated film adaptation of Al-Ma'arri's significant work, *The Epistle of Forgiveness*, a

social satire in which he denounces hypocrisy by transporting his contemporaries to the afterlife. Amal sketches a caricature of her war-ravaged city using the same process as Al-Maâri, transporting her colleagues and entourage to the afterlife.

Through her work and connection with Al-Maâri, Amal questions herself and faces the fate of many artists who must choose between expressing themselves and protecting themselves. As her friends and boyfriend face censorship and risk their lives, Amal realises that an artist lives only through their art.

Based on a bold cultural heritage that escaped censorship, this work is a cry for freedom in the face of a crumbling system crushed by the weight of dogmas and prohibitions. We try to stage what Al-Maâri provokes in us of intimacy and spirituality to remind our contemporaries that resistance through Art is the way to reach 'Freedom'.

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
#### **NALEDI**



Zein is an orphan hedgehog who lives in a prison-like facility for the physically challenged. The goal is to "fix" them and send them back into the world.

Zein has a bag with magical powers that can pull away his negative emotions, like fear, depression, and hunger. However, he's unaware of how aggressive he has become because of this. His spikes are always on edge, and they shoot out uncontrollably, injuring those around him.

Inside the bag, the emotions become fascinating creatures and monsters in a magical world. Knowing the value of the emotions inside, an evil rhino is after the bag.

He wants to use them to create emotional pieces of art.

Clumsy and deformed but funny and resourceful, Zein and his friends fight the rhino before he takes all the emotions of the town. During the battle, they discover the creatures inside the bag and learn to reevaluate themselves and their deformities. They see the miracle hiding within each of them.

Spiky to the Core is a story that invites children to look at negative things differently. It's a message that no one should dictate how we view ourselves, and we should never allow anyone to define us.

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# A BUTTERFLY HUG

Shahd dreams of becoming a famous actress and social media influencer, and Abdelrahman wants to be a cinematographer and film director. Together, they have decided to make a short movie. Despite the difficult circumstances that surround our characters, such as complications of the dreaded disease that prevent them from filming their movie and publishing new videos, and confine them to bed all the time, as well as the frustration that no one cares about their pictures and movies.

Their parents, however, worry they may not live long enough to achieve their goals. It is difficult for them to do simple tasks like showering or getting dressed. A small cut or blister that does not heal can lead to an infection needing hospitalisation. Yet, their creative desire is strong, and they still make the most out of every day.

Shahd lives in bustling Giza and hates school.

She left her school in the 9th grade due to bullying. Not dropping out, EB has delayed her puberty, and she is small for her age, suffering from low self-esteem. She hopes that the film she is making with Abdelrahman will grow her social media following, boosting her self-confidence so that one day she may return to school. In contrast, Abdelrahman is studying to finish high school and pursue his college studies in Cairo, away from his village where everyone knows him and pities him because of his condition.

The film follows their journey by using cinema verité style, portraying the challenges and small daily victories of these young people while exploring what it means to be a teenager—to live and express oneself authentically when others say you cannot.



#### **DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT**

Shahd and Abdelrahman reflect my teenage self, defying societal norms. Despite opposition, I pursued filmmaking, like Shahd's journey as a YouTuber. Their struggles remind me of my own battle for acceptance. Through A Butterfly Hug, I explore their unique voices, marginalised by society and their rare skin disorder. The film aims to shed light on their challenges, inspire social change, and highlight the Yasmine Al-Samra Foundation's vital work.

# **BORN A GIRL**

Seven days after my birth, as an infant, like my four other sisters, I was subjected to female genital mutilation.

Growing up, I always had this feeling of being different, of not being fully myself. No one had explained to me how or why I was deprived of this organ. The subject was never discussed in the family. Despite fierce opposition from my family, I had my first repair at the age of 21, but I still live with the physical and psychological after-effects of this practice. Today, I have decided to undertake a restoration to get my body back. Clitoral restoration, which is a surgical procedure,

aims to restore part or all of the clitoris in women who have had it removed.

But this restoration is not just physical. For my psychological recovery, I need to have the support of my mother and my sisters, to know that there is at least one person who understands me and regrets not having done anything to save me. They were all over 25 at the time. Their decision could have changed the course of my life. As the youngest of 13 children, I have to face my mother, through whom decisions are made, my sisters who are also victims, the eldest of whom is the one who fights for this macabre tradition to continue.

#### DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT

The communities involved in our project come from Burkina Faso's inner areas, with the exception of the doctors based in towns. In Côte d'Ivoire, we collaborate with an association dedicated to repairing and restoring victims of genital mutilation. As someone who has undergone mutilation, along with my sisters, I passionately share our story through the perspectives of my mother, Djè, and sister, Mamou. Our team, led by the experienced cameraman Samasekou Ousmane, has a personal connection to the subject and has forged strong relationships during our scouting process.

#### DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER PROFILE

Kady Traoré is a Burkinabè producer and director, born in Bobo Dioulasso in Western Burkina Faso. She entered the film industry in 1998 as an actress and has acted in several feature films and TV series. In 2013, she graduated from the Institut Supérieur de l'Image et du Son, and in 2014, she created Athena Films. She has directed two feature films, one short film, a 26-episode TV series, and one medium-length documentary. This project is her first feature documentary.

# MY DREAM TO FLY

After the passing of Osama's brother, who died in a street motorcycle race, he wishes to fulfil his dream of competing in international championships. Osama earns a living on his cheap Chinese motorcycle every morning in the slums of Cairo. However, at night, this motorcycle becomes legendary. Osama uses it to speed through the streets of Cairo at 100km/hr. If his feet touch the ground, he loses - or dies. The film takes us into Osama's struggle.

Osama is now a father to a beautiful young girl named Waad and this sport is dangerous. It is a sport and art for young men who are agile and fit, and have little to lose. Osama needs to make many choices, he has to fight many fights and decide whether to follow his heart or be more responsible for his family and community. From an outsider's look in, it seems as though Osama's juggling act in his own life is more of the game at hand.

Born and raised in rural slums, I resonate deeply with the characters in the film. Their struggles reflect my own dreams and fears in the region I call home. Riding motorcycles provided moments of escape, reminding me of the courage to express myself despite societal restrictions. 

# **PULO**

Through a recollection of clips filmed in 1974 and 1990, combined with presentday footage, Pülö investigates the various forms of pollution in Okrika, a Niger Delta community located in the southern part of Nigeria. It is a story about the liaw tribe by the Atlantic Ocean and their inclination to water, and the risk of losing such a cherished and fundamental resource to 'big oil'. The Niger Delta, which used to be on par with the Amazon rainforest due to its biodiversity. is now considered to be one of the most polluted regions on planet Earth.

The documentary portrays the environmental socio-economic effects through various voices. Christina's voice is one of them - as the film's producer and director who is also an indigene directly affected by the island's

environmental degradation. She narrates personal experiences in her hometown and links the grief associated with losing her grandmother with the gradual decay and degradation of her people's land, water, and culture. Who are we when we lose the traditional knowledge and practice of ancestors, whose only link to us is the environment they once dwelled in?

Pülö hinges on the passing of time through archives, the role of the people as cultural custodians, the sacredness of water, and the risk of losing one's identity with the spreading of neo-colonial models. The most heartbreaking detail is the constant question the film probes: will this be the last time we ever hear of this island?

#### DIRECTOR'S/PRODUCER STATEMENT

Pülö poses the question: will a solution ever arise? Water holds sacred significance in indigenous communities worldwide, including Okrika in the Niger Delta. As 'nomads of the seas,' these water people emphasise their deep connection to this vital resource. transcending civilization and defining their existence. However, the discovery of Pülö (oil) poses a sudden threat to their lives.

A ray of light streams into the dark room where Gift is barely visible. She doesn't earn enough to send money to her son, Michel, in Nigeria. The accidental birth of Blossom, whose existence nobody knows about, is holding her back in her quest for Europe. As usual, she talks to herself and recalls everything she has experienced since 2017 - her departure from Lagos and the abandonment of her son. She remembers Slimity, Youcef, Favor, and Biggie in Agadez - their laughter and their angry days.

From Agadez to her attempt to cross the Moroccan border, and through her family memories, Gift immerses us in the fragility of her past, revealing the true reasons behind a woman's search for well-being. The waiting, the journey, the doubts, the death, the life, the confession, the truth, the sea, and the mother - they all unveil the ultimate quest of Gift's soul.

# NOMADIC ECHO

In the Malian capital, 20-something year olds Bamako, Moha and Mohamed Ali, Baken, children of Tuareg musicians and cultural promoters originally from the desert of Timbuktu, decide to form a music group with contemporary pop-rap sounds. Their lyrics constantly reference the spirit of a nomadicdesert world, which they claim to identify with despite not having lived it.

Throughout their daily lives, research, and rehearsals, these young people will confront their elders and seek the knowledge and experience of iconic figures such as Manny Ansar, founder of the Festival in the Desert, and Aq-Na, producer and promoter of Tuareq music; Amano, the last legendary griot from the region of Timbuktu; Disco, singer of the female ensemble Tartit; and Abdallah, poetleader of the group Tinariwen. Starting from the desert, the latter have been fighting for 40 years to preserve Tuareg culture, and now aspire to "pass the baton" to their offspring.

The story will be enriched by the obstacles that the young people will have to face and overcome. Beginning with their mother tongue, which they do not always master, Tamasheq. Another factor will be the perception of their approach, which is bound to raise suspicions and reservations among the elders. Their exchanges will provide an opportunity to shed light on this paradoxical relationship between two generations.

Despite the conflicts and apparent contradictions, there is an obvious mirror game between these two generations. The daily lives of these young people, their dreams for the future, and their connection to the world through technological tools perfectly echo the desires of their parents when they left the desert camp in the early 1970s to discover the big city and, for some, to explore the world.

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


#### **FEMI ODUGBEMI**

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
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
